

Dear Students,

The curriculum of the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences of the University of Miskolc, Hungary contains all the information that students need to support them during their studies in Miskolc.

This booklet contains the model curriculum for the programme in question, which you can follow to complete the number of credits specified for the programme over the duration of your studies.

In order to obtain a Master's degree, it is compulsory to complete 120 credit points.

Please note that, in accordance with Article 54.§ (1) of Government Decree No. 87/2015 (9.IV.), the recommended curriculum, with the exception of the individual school placement in the 5-year Teacher Training Programme, has a credit value of 30 credits +/- 3 credits per semester, which ensures optimal progress in the student's studies.

For further information, please contact the institutes responsible for the respective programme or the Student Services Department of Directorate of Education and Quality Assurance.

Please note that Volume III of the Organisational and Operational Regulations of the University of Miskolc is the Student Requirements System, which will guide you in matters of academic administration. Please read the regulations carefully and follow the instructions (https://www.uni-miskolc.hu).

Language examination requirements for the diploma and other important study information

1.) In accordance with Article 49/A of the Act on National Higher Education, the Faculty ensures the development of the foreign language skills required for the praxis of the professional qualification of the degree programme through compulsory foreign language literature requirements / foreign language professional assignments / optional or professional courses announced in a foreign language.

2.) There is a separate regulation for the preparation of the **Bachelor's or Master's thesis** required for the degree: The Regulation for the Preparation of the Bachelor's or Master's Thesis of the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences of the University of Miskolc, which can be downloaded from the Faculty's website (<u>https://bolcsesz.uni-miskolc.hu/uj/index.php</u>).

3.) **Transfer between programmes** is regulated in the relevant section of the Faculty's Student Requirements Regulations (KHKR), where students should note that transfer between Bachelor's and Master's programmes is only possible within the same degree level and field of study.

4.) The procedure for reclassification between government-subsidised/government (partial) scholarship and fee-based/self-funded forms of higher education programmes is set out in the relevant Article of the Student Requirements Regulations (HKR). Therefore, students are informed that from the first semester of the academic year 2016/2017, a reclassification procedure from state-subsidised/state (partial) scholarship to fee-based/self-funded forms will apply in the following two cases. One is if the Hungarian state (partial) scholarship student with active student status has not acquired at least 15 credits, or 18 credits in the case of law and science programmes, as an average of the number of credits acquired in the last two semesters, as determined by the Directorate for Education and Quality Assurance at the end of the academic year. The other is if the Hungarian state (partial) scholarship student has failed to achieve a weighted grade point average (GPA) as specified in the Student Requirements Regulations (HKR).

5.) Students' **enrolment and registration obligations** are governed by the Student Requirements Regulations. Please note that in order for your term to <u>be considered active</u>, you must <u>register</u> <u>electronically in the Neptun system and attend at least one course.</u>

6.) According to Article 47(1a) of the Act CCIV of 2011 on National Higher Education, a student with student status in a disciplinary MA programme **may also pursue parallel studies in a teacher training MA programme.**
