

CEEPUS Network

A CEEPUS network means the international partnership of higher education institutions' smaller units, e.g. faculties or departments. These participating units create a thematic network on a specific or interdisciplinary academic field.

Network applications

Institutions are expected to form new networks or join an already existing network. Min. 3 institutions from min. 3 CEEPUS countries form a network, with one of them undertaking the role of the coordinator. The coordinating institution will be responsible for submitting the application, for managing the project throughout the academic year and for submitting the final report. Intensive, all-sided communication between the partners is extremely important.

Mobility applications of individual applicants (students / teaching staff)

Applications can be submitted electronically only at <http://www.ceepus.info>

- 1) in the framework of approved networks.
Deadline for the autumn semester: 15 June
for the spring semester: 31 October
- 2) Freemover applications outside the networks:
 - for the winter/first semester: continuously, usually starting on 1st July, open until availability
 - for the summer/second semester: 30th November

Summer Schools / Intensive courses

- organised in the framework of running networks by any of the partner institutions
- requirements: min. 36 hours of instruction in min. 6 days (up to 10 days with 60 working hours)
- awarding credits is compulsory

Study excursions for students

- organised for scientific or artistic purposes by the host institution
- duration can be 3 – 6 days
- awarding credits is compulsory
- no freemover applications for excursions

Joint programmes/degrees

- Degree course curricula mutually developed by min. 2 universities in min. 2 countries

- Degree jointly awarded but separately issued by min. 2 universities with full national recognition in each country
- Joint degree awarded and issued by min. 2 universities with full national recognition in each country, or issued as a supplement to one or two nationally recognised degrees
